

## Maryville Park and Recreation Committee Notes

July 21, 2025 @ 6:00 pm

Motion was made to approve the June minutes by Shellie Lee. Seconded by Tom Fitzgerald.

**Correspondence :** Jessica Weissert has resigned.

**Past Events :** Kayak Day

153 signed up with another 40 walk ins. Everything was more spread out this year which worked much better than in the past. Everybody left happy.

Movie in the Park: There were estimated 200 people there. The obstacle course was a great draw however more than 2 people are needed to help man it. Lori Becker says we need 5 people: 2 in the front, 2 in the back and 1 on the side. Younger children were getting in there and the older kids were going over the sides to bypass the younger ones. Mike suggested we get 2 bounce houses in the future: one for the younger kids and the obstacle course for the older kids. Gateway said they could get us 2 for \$400. Mike is also buying beads for a necklace craft.

We have 2 concerts coming up: The Trilogy Band and the Dueling Pianos on August 2<sup>nd</sup> and August 16<sup>th</sup> respectively.

**Mayor's Comments :** Mayor Wayne White thanked all the volunteers on the committee and was glad to see Heritage Museum setting up a table at the kayaking event.

He also spoke about the grants that Tonya is working on presently. She applied for the Osland Grant in which we are hoping to receive \$400,000. It would be used at Drost Park to resurface parking lots, do some overhauls on the bathrooms, fix the ADE playground, install a new boat launch along with a kayak launch. In addition, the grant would build more pickleball courts.

In addition to this, Tonya received the grant to pay for the fishing derby.

Mayor Wayne White was impressed by the number of people that came from nearby towns to attend the Moana 2 movie. Upon speaking to families he discovered people had come from Alhambra, Wood River, Collinsville and several other towns to attend it. Tonya has also applied for the MEPRD grant for \$150,000 to be used for the pavilion. We have \$70,000 in our account. The rest will come from TIFF funds. Julie Clark said we need to take the thermostat down. The bid to start the pavilion will start in August. Work may start by October. Our goal is to have it built by spring 2026. Mayor White told the committee that when we are confronted with haters about raising money for the pavilion that we should tell them we are raising money to invest in Maryville.

**Trustee Comments:** Julie mentioned that the MERS gazebo is overgrown and needs some work. She and Wayne had discussed options for cleaning it up. The family would be contacted first to find out if they had plans to work on it.

Julie also wondered if we were still interested in getting fountains for Drost lake. Julie found a company called Casco. Mike mentioned that the lake treatment we got for \$1272 was very effective. We are getting emergent vegetation now that the moss has been knocked down. It was decided that we stay with the treatments for now. As solar fountains improve, we can look to them in the future. Julie will research this further.

Mike also mentioned that in the case of rain, we can easily reschedule because we are not paying mailing costs since the movie is downloaded from the screen.

**Mayor's Comments :** Wayne reiterated that to get events well attended, we might need to spend more money than in the past and that is ok with him. He does not want to do things cheaply. He also mentioned that he spoke to Anne Matthews who said the Maryville Farmer's Market is struggling. She will be attending our meeting next month to discuss ways to promote the market.

**Trustees Comments :** Julie Clark informed us that Tonya was able to get a \$1000.00 grant for the Fishing Derby and for restocking the lake. Mike told us that the lake will be getting a treatment to kill the algae in the next week or two. The dying algae can sometimes kill some fish so don't be surprised if you see dead fish in the lake.

**Build Maryville :** October 16<sup>th</sup> is a date being thrown out as a possible new date for the Music Fest. This would be October 16<sup>th</sup> of 2026. Julie has to approach the Kiwanis about this. We are checking out tents to rent for the event and the committee has decided to charge individuals for the event instead of relying on sponsors. Past sponsors will get free wristbands and will be displayed for their past sponsorship.

**Disc Golf :** A new development has occurred where we can't obtain the actual baskets for the course. They come from Canada and Canada is holding shipments up due to the tariffs. We have no idea when they will come in.
