Things to know for the Village of Maryville:

“THE DO’s”:

- Village of Maryville’s website: www.maryville-il.us
- ISO Rating for the Village dropped from a rating of 5 to a rating of 4. You should contact your home insurance provider; this lower rating may result in a premium reduction.
- A recent poll listed Maryville as the 6th safest community in the State of Illinois.
- You can obtain a free larger recycling container from Republic Services. Just call customer service at 656-6883 to request one.
- Maryville’s contract with Republic Services includes 2 large item clean-up/pick-up services each year. The next large item pick-up week is September 12 thru September 16, 2016 (on your normal trash day). See our website for guidelines for what can and what cannot be picked up.
- Residents age 62 and older can receive a reduced trash service rate of \$9.00 per month. Contact Republic Services at 656-6883.
- Free Notary services are available at Village Hall for residents during normal business hours.
- Voter Registration services are available at Village Hall during normal business hours.
- Automatic checking account debit is available for water/sewer bill payments. Please contact Water Clerk, Melissa Bailey at 345-7029 for questions and to set this up.
- Water/sewer bills can now be received electronically. Please contact Water Clerk, Melissa Bailey at 345-7029 for questions and to set up.
- Please make sure street address numbers are prominently displayed on homes and buildings. This will help emergency responders reach the correct location.

- There are several committees that are seeking volunteers. Please contact Mayor Gulledge at 345-7028 x7 or mayor@maryville-il.us if interested in volunteering.
- Brush and limb pickup is available free of charge the first full week (Monday – Friday) of each month. Please call 345-7029 to add your address to the pickup list.
- Maryville residents can use the Collinsville Township Highway Department’s yard waste dumpster for depositing yard waste and leaves during normal Township hours. The Township Highway Department is located at 1407 North Bluff Road in Collinsville.
- The Police Department would like to remind all residents to keep your vehicles locked and garage doors closed to deter thefts.
- Maryville is home to 4 established parks. Drost Park located directly behind the Village Hall Complex; Firemen’s Park located in front of the Firehouse on N. Donk Street; Fred Winters’ Park located off West Main Street to Gary Avenue to Duke Drive; Pleasant Ridge Park located off of Pleasant Ridge Road. Park hours are dawn to dusk.

“THE DON’Ts”:

(Please make note of the below issues as most of these points are covered under Village Ordinances and carry a penalty/fine if a violation occurs.)

- It is the property owner’s responsibility to keep tree limbs and bushes from overhanging public sidewalks and streets. Please keep limbs and bushes trimmed.
- Please do not blow grass clippings onto the street. These clippings will clog the storm drains. Also please do not leave grass clippings and/or gravel on sidewalks or streets.
- Trash cans should not be left at the curb or sidewalk. After pickup, trash cans need to be stored in the garage or in the side or back yard.
- Basketball goals are not allowed on streets or public sidewalks.
- Please make sure the roof drain and sump pump drain from your home or business are not discharging within 10’ of the street or sidewalk.
- It is illegal to hook a sump pump or roof drains into the public sanitary sewer line.
- Please do not block public sidewalks or streets with vehicles, trailers, boats, etc.
- Burning restrictions – Maryville allows burning of yard waste on Fridays and Saturdays during the hours of 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., and only if weather conditions are favorable.
- Please inspect your property to eliminate unnecessary standing water, such as unused bird baths and lawn ornaments, unused swimming pools, etc. Mosquitoes can lay larvae in a container of water as small as a bottle cap.
- Boats, RV’s and trailers are not allowed to be parked in driveways or streets. They can be stored in the rear yard or on the side of your home if enclosed with a fence.
- The curfew for minors under the age of 17 is 11 p.m. Sunday to Thursday and 12 midnight on Friday and Saturday.
